

Scholarship Eligibility Requirements:

1. Be a U.S. Citizen and Nebraska resident enrolled full-time in a program of study at an accredited university, college, or post-secondary vocational/technical program located within the United States, or be a U.S. Citizen enrolled full-time in an educational institution located within Nebraska, at the time of application. (High School students are not eligible to apply.)
 - If currently attending a four-year accredited university or college you must have completed a minimum of 24 credit hours OR
 - If currently attending a two-year accredited community college or vocational/technical program you must have completed a minimum of 12 credit hours OR
 - If currently attending an accredited training certification program, you must have half of total curriculum requirements/classroom hours completed.
 - If pursuing a Master's, Post-baccalaureate or Doctorate degree, provide proof of acceptance or proof of enrollment in a graduate program.
2. Have a minimum 2.5 grade point average.
3. Be actively involved in community service via volunteer-basis contributions.
4. Remain enrolled as a full-time student in the first academic term following receipt of the award.

Scholarship Application "To Do" List:

1. Provide unofficial school transcripts (classes completed and grades) – Please upload directly to the online submission form (found at the bottom of the application), or email to sevenmileridez@hotmail.com and include "Transcripts for J.S.S.S Application" in the subject line.
2. Complete and submit our online application form which includes the following:
 - a. Provide one (1) short essay in response to the following questions:
 - i. What contributions have you made towards community service for the betterment of others?
 - ii. Why do you feel community service is important and how can your involvement positively impact others as well as your own life goals?
 - b. Reference Contact Info (a person of reference that we have permission to contact to confirm your community involvement) – This can be a teacher, non-profit administrator, boss, co-worker, etc.
 - c. Documented Volunteer Work that shows your involvement and community accomplishments as well as relevant background information:
 - i. Academic Activities
 - ii. Community Service
 - iii. Extracurricular Activities
 - iv. Automotive-Related Activities
 - v. Honors and Awards
 - vi. Work Experience
 - vii. Military Experience
